

Selectieprocedure KBSF LT YOG 2020

Het BOIC mag afhankelijk van nog te behalen quota-plaatsen maximaal drie Belgische junior-heren alsook maximaal drie Belgische junior-dames inschrijven voor de YOG. De KBSF heeft echter slechts 1 atleet in de correcte leeftijdscategorie, een junior-dame.

De KBSF heeft bij het opstellen van deze LT-criteria voor YOG 2020 rekening gehouden met het feit dat in het seizoen 2019-2020 slechts 1 Belgische junior-dame voldoet aan de ISU- & KBSF-criteria om deel te nemen aan de Junior World Cups in Bjugn & Enschede, alwaar de resterende 24 quota-plaatsen voor deelname aan de YOG gerealiseerd dienen te worden. Dit betekent dat bij voornoemde Junior World Cups alle landen, die aanspraak wensen te maken op deelname aan de YOG, vertegenwoordigd zullen zijn.

Voornoemde junior-dame zal hierdoor deelnemen in een zeer sterk bezet internationaal veld van dames geboren tussen 1-07-2000 en 30-06-2004, waarbij zij zelf geboren is op 24-05-2003.

Indien deze junior-dame de genoemde quota-plaats conform de selectiecriteria van de ISU weet te behalen, acht de KBSF deze dame ruim voldoende gekwalificeerd om op competitieve wijze België te vertegenwoordigen op de YOG in de discipline snelschaatsen – langebaan.

De betreffende junior-dame, Fran Vanhoutte, heeft zich bovendien vorig seizoen, tussen deelnemers geboren tussen 1-07-1999 en 30-06-2003, middels een 15^e-plaats in haar allereerste Mass Start al doen opmerken. Tevens behaalde ze deze zomer in het inlineskaten 3x goud tijdens het EK voor Juniores en voorziet de KBSF een verdere progressie in het snelschaatsen op de langebaan in dit seizoen 2019-2020, waarin ze naast de reguliere afstanden ook haar 2^e en 3^e Mass Start zal rijden.

2. Remaining open YOG Quota Places

The allocation of the remaining YOG Quota Places will be based on the results of the following designated ISU Junior World Cup Competitions:

- ISU Junior World Cup 1: November 16-17, 2019 Bjugn, NOR
- ISU Junior World Cup 2: November 23-24, 2019 Enschede, NED

Please note that the Host Member/NOC has the right to enter one (1) Woman and one (1) Man if not qualified through the ordinary qualification procedure. Such entries will not increase the total number of participants. If the Host Member/NOC has not qualified for a quota place, this entry will instead substitute the entry of the Member/NOC with the last qualified YOG Quota Place of the category (Women or Men) concerned.

To be entered for the YOG an athlete must have achieved YOG qualifying times requirements. The applicable YOG qualifying times are the following:

Distance	Women	Men

Qualifying times must have been achieved during the period between July 1, 2018 and December 8, 2019. If an athlete has achieved at least one of the above qualifying times, the athlete may compete in any of the events at the YOG.

3. Timeline for acceptance/rejection of allocated YOG Quota Places and entries

- July 1, 2018 - December 8, 2019 – Period to achieve qualifying times.
- December 3, 2019 – ISU to inform Members/NOCs of their allocated Quota Places and Stand-By Quota Places.
- December 3 - 8, 2019 – Members/NOCs to confirm acceptance/rejection of allocated YOG Quota Places to ISU.
- December 8 - 14, 2019 – Reallocation Period - In the case of ISU Members/NOCs informing ISU of not using certain YOG Quota Places, ISU to re-allocate such unused YOG Quota Places to the Members/NOCs according to the list of Stand-by Quota Places. ISU Members/NOCs being offered an unused Quota Place to react within 48 hours of receipt of the ISU notification
- December 15, 2019 – ISU to announce confirmed use of allocated and reallocated quota places.
- December 16, 2019 – YOG 2020 Sport Entries deadline.
- From December 17, 2019 – Late Athlete Replacement Period implemented according to IOC late Athlete Replacement Policy (policy and deadlines to be confirmed/follow by the IOC).

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

Quotas are allocated and distributed according to the following principles:

- Entry quotas are allotted based on results from the 2019 ISU World Junior Speed Skating Championships and designated ISU Junior World Cup Speed Skating Competitions during the 2019/2020 season.
- An allotted quota place applies for one athlete. This athlete will be eligible to compete in all individual distances, as long as the NOC maximum quota for the event will not be exceeded.

to be held during the Lausanne 2020 Youth Olympic Games season in accordance with the ISU Junior World Cup ranking for the respective distances.

D.2.2 For the NOCs which qualified two (2) quota places for a gender in accordance with D.1.1, the two (2) highest ranked NOC skaters in the ISU Junior World Cup Speed Skating ranking will be disregarded in the allocation of additional quota places in accordance with D.2.1.

D.2.3 For the NOCs which qualified one (1) quota place for a gender in accordance with D.1, the highest ranked NOC skater in the ISU Junior World Cup ranking will be disregarded in the allocation of additional quota places.

D.2.4 The remaining quota places will be allocated based on the following sequence, with the additional condition that if the same athlete is represented in the Junior World Cup Speed Skating rankings in more than one of the distances considered, only the highest distance rank of this skater will be considered for the allocation of quota place to the respective NOC:

1. First place rank in 500m allocated first
2. First place rank in 1500m
3. Second place rank in 500m
4. Second place rank in 1500m
5. etc...

D.2.5 The distribution of the quota places for each gender according to D.2 will continue until the total quota of 32 men and 32 women has been filled. However, for each gender the following conditions apply: Before allocation of a third (3rd) quota place to some NOC, priority will be given to allocating further quota places to other NOCs in the next quota allocation positions (according to the quota allocation procedure defined in D.2.4 above) in the ISU Junior World Cup Speed Skating ranking.

D.3 Quota places achieved, by way of D.1 or D.2, can be used for all the individual distances (i.e. 500 meters, 1500 meters and Mass start events). However, the maximum of two (2) entries per individual event will apply for all NOCs.
